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Does Ireland have a battery energy storage system?

Ireland's ESB has opened a battery energy storage system at its Poolberg site in Dublin. Operational since November, the battery plant is capable of providing 75 MW of energy for two hours to Ireland's electricity system. It features high-capacity batteries that store excess renewable energy for discharge when required.

What will ESB's new battery plant do for Ireland?

ESB, the state-owned electricity company, has announced the opening of a major battery plant at its site in Poolbeg, Dublin. The battery plant will add around 75 MW of fast-acting energy storage to make the grid in Ireland more stable and increase the share of renewables in the electricity system.

Will battery storage help Ireland generate 80% renewable electricity by 2030?

Ireland has set a target of generating 80% renewable electricity by 2030. Deployment of battery storage will be capable of responding in milliseconds to frequency changes, importing or exporting electricity from the grid as needed, and helping efficiently stabilise the grid, while guaranteeing reliable electricity supply for users.

Does Ireland need more energy storage?

Analysis being conducted by ESI suggests that Ireland is going to need up to seven times more energy storage than what is being stored today. "That said, the Government does realise that, and there is a national energy storage strategy in place, published last July and which is very welcome."
